Dear Friends,

I am so grateful to you all for your ongoing support of and connection to FVJC. The energy we all felt being together (safely) over the High Holidays has strengthened our desire to work to deliver meaningful, warm, inclusive worship opportunities that make you feel as though you were sitting in the sanctuary among friends. – Doing so, however, is a significant challenge.

The fact is that there is no one technology that does it all. Zoom enables congregants to see and "chat" with each other and to participate in the service in an interactive way. However, some of you are distracted by the "Zoom boxes", poorer sound quality, and the bit of chaos that naturally occurs when multiple people are trying to speak. In addition, recent stories of Zoom hacking at local political and religious events make it clear that we not only have to think about security in the sanctuary but online as well. --- Others of you find the live stream less complicated, less distracting and enjoy the excellent sound and video quality. Still others find the livestream less emotionally connected and prefer being able to chat and comment in Zoom. No one technological approach will work for everyone at every moment.

Please know that many of us are working extremely hard to ensure that we deliver services to you in the safest

and most meaningful way possible and that we are in the process of developing a monthly menu of services in the same way that our offerings were different each week before the pandemic. In the next week or so when we are more facile with the technological options available to us we will share the final plan. For now, know that each week you will have an email in your box telling you exactly how to access Shabbat services and other important programming.

I know that this transition is challenging. It is for me too! But we want to be sure that we bring you the best blend of everything we have to offer. We also know that many of you miss having machzorim at your disposal. Included in this special Shofar, thanks to the generosity of Dave Kravet, we have included a hand out with our central prayers so that you can follow along each week. MORe COMMITTEE Membership, Outreach and Retention

Since the beginning of the current pandemic members of the Board of Directors and other volunteers have been making outreach calls to our FVJC members. We checked in to see how everyone was doing. Did anyone need groceries or help accessing anything? Did they need someone to talk to? Could Rabbi Bekah be of any assistance? The conversations evolved over the subsequent rounds of calls and people shared their feelings of being alone. Folks were very appreciative for the calls and even volunteered to make future calls to others. The calls and conversations helped us forge more connections and the connections we made in turn have made our community stronger and more resilient. New friends were made and previous friendships were renewed as these touch points took on more meaning.

With the High Holidays approaching we knew we wanted to find another way to connect with our members in a safe but meaningful way. Folks brainstormed and soon we had the makings of our High Holiday Goody bags. A bakery in Brooklyn was contacted and 250 challahs were delivered to Simsbury at 11 pm one night! Honey sticks, apple treats, yahrzeit candles and shabbat candles were assembled and labeled. Rabbi Bekah developed her thoughtful handouts so we would be equipped to usher in the High Holidays, alone yet together. A small but mighty socially distanced team assembled 250 bags in the multipurpose room. A wonderful group of volunteers, including Rabbi Bekah and her children, welcomed our FVJC community on Sunday September 6th as we conducted our "touchless" event. The Social Action Committee collected approximately 100 bags of food as the donations were swapped out for Goody bags. Smiles and positive energy were as bountiful as the sunshine. We were fortunate enough to welcome some new families into our FVJC Community that day!

During the week following the drive through event, a small army of volunteers spread out across the Farmington Valley and delivered the remainder of the Goody Bags and again new friends were made and doorstep conversations flourished. It turns out we were all looking to make connections and wish others a L'Shanah Tovah.

The MORe (Membership, Outreach and Retention) committee very much appreciates the generous contributions of the Men's Club, Sisterhood and the Pascal Family who donated to help purchase all the yummy goodies and candles used in our outreach. We would also like to thank those who signed up to help in various capacities to get this large project completed. When we work together, we can get so much accomplished!
