Friends,

I hope your Pesach has been filled with family, frogs, freedom and delicious recipes! As we near the other side of the tunnel we've been traveling through for the last year, we can see a little light at the end of it and taste hope again. Hope has not always been easy to find for our people. Even though we are in the midst of Pesach, a holiday filled with hope, right around the corner looms Yom HaShoah, also known as Holocaust Remembrance Day. Shoah, which means "catastrophe" or "utter destruction" in Hebrew, refers to the atrocities that were committed against the lewish people during World War II. It is hard to find hope when your world has been utterly destroyed. Today, we mark Yom HaShoah by lighting yellow candles (sent out by our Men's Club) to keep the memories of the victims alive. We spend 24 hours reading the names of as many victims as we can, and we gather together at the beginning and the conclusion of those 24 hours to pray, sing and hear the stories of survivors. This year, we will be marking Yom HaShoah from 6pm on Wednesday, April 7th until 6pm on Thursday, April 8th. I hope you'll join us and sign up below to read names. Please do not forget to light your yellow candle in memory of all those whose lives were lost. Together, we remember the victims and are reminded that hope can light up even the darkest nights.

#### YOM HaSHOAH LIGHT A YELLOW CANDLE TO REMEMBER THOSE WHO PERISHED

Please remember to light your Yom HaShoah candle on Wednesday evening, April 7. Yom HaShoah is the holiday to remember the Holocaust. Each Yellow Yahrzeit Candle that is lit will perpetuate our commitment to remember the Holocaust. The yellow color recalls the badges Jews were forced to wear in Nazi-occupied Europe, and their flame inspires hope for our world to be a more tolerant place for all.

These candles were provided to members of our congregation by the Men's Club and were included this year with your Passover Bags.

In addition to lighting your candle, please join our congregation this year as we commemorate Yom HaShoah by reading names of those who perished in the Holocaust. This reading will take place, virtually, over a 24-hour period from Wednesday, April 7, 6:00 pm through Thursday, April 8, 6:00 pm.





## Yom HaZikaron & Yom HaAtzmaut

Yom HaZikaron is Israel's Memorial Day for the Fallen Soldiers of Israel and Victims of Terrorism. It is the day of national remembrance in Israel to commemorate all those who lost their lives during the struggle to defend the State of Israel. Yom HaZikaron starts this year on Wednesday evening, April 14, 2021. Yom HaAtzmaut is Israel's Independence Day which marks the anniversary of the establishment of the modern state of Israel in 1948. Yom HaAtzmaut begins this year on Thursday evening, April 15, 2021.

Yom HaZikaron (Memorial Day) comes right before Yom HaAtzmaut (Independence Day) to remind us of the sacrifices that were made for Israel's independence and security. Please take some time over these two days to learn more about Israel and its importance as the spiritual homeland for the Jewish people.
