## BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

We are announcing updated protocols for June through August. We are delighted to say that we are reopening and getting ever closer to "normal." Please note that we will conduct a survey shortly to assess the rate of vaccination in our FVJC community. The following protocols may be amended somewhat based on the survey findings. The FVJC community has been enormously patient during this very difficult year and we thank you all for your commitment to FVJC and to the health and safety of the community.

Effective immediately, the following protocols will be in place:

### **Shabbat Services:**

Indoor Shabbat services will have a capacity of 75 congregants in the expanded Sanctuary/Social Hall area. We will ask congregants to remain masked while indoors at FVJC at this time.

Oneg Shabbats will not take place indoors at this time.

Outdoor Shabbat services will have an unlimited capacity and congregants who have been vaccinated are welcome to be unmasked at outdoor services. Unvaccinated congregants should take care to maintain social distance. We will be resuming Oneg Shabbats for our outdoor services

### B'nai Mitzvah:

B'nai Mitzvah will also have a capacity of 75 guests. We ask that everyone remain masked for these events. In cases where only the immediate family will be in the sanctuary and vaccination status can be assured families can be unmasked.

### **Mah Jongg:**

Our beloved Mah Jongg Mondays will resume in the Social Hall. A survey is currently being conducted to determine the extent to which this group is vaccinated. Masking protocols will follow pending the results of that survey. We encourage any immunocompromised players to continue to mask. Snacks will not be provided during Mah Jongg at this time.

### **High Holidays:**

We are eager to return to the sanctuary for High Holidays, but only if we can do so safely. We will be sending a survey to you all shortly to begin to assess our community "herd immunity" and our congregation's comfort level with returning to larger events and will make the best possible decisions pending those results. At present, we can announce that many of our High Holiday services will take place at FVJC. We are working through options for our largest services in order to ensure safety for all.

We look forward to seeing you all at home, in our sanctuary, over the next several weeks.

### SHS senior wins essay competition



At the April meeting of the Metacomet Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1926, Commander John Fox congratulated Petra M. 






# COMMITTEE NEWS


