Your fingers are needed to work our phones. We recently discovered that the phones, which are in every classroom and many of the public rooms, have some special buttons that everyone should know about. If you press feature key #7, you can broadcast to everyone in the building. This is important to know about in case of an emergency, though should only be shared with responsible synagogue members. If you want to dial out on a phone, you must press the function button #3. This allows you to call out if you want to call 911, or if you have a pizza emergency.


