

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Loel Goldblatt

Dear Friends.

In my recent note about the 2023-2024 Slate of Officers, I mentioned that we've made some changes to the leadership model for our Executive Board of Directors to ease the workload of the President. I'd like to share with you a little more about this leadership transition here.

Our Board of Directors consists of Directors and Officers. In accordance with our bylaws, the Board of Directors manages the business and financial affairs of the congregation. It comprises the leadership of the Farmington Valley Jewish Congregation Emek Shalom and many also serve a dual role by leading some of our committees. The Officers include the President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. The Officers together with the Past President form the Executive Board of Directors. Together, there are currently 19 lay leaders who make up our FVJC-ES Board of Directors.

The purpose of our committees is to formally bring together people with relevant interest or expertise to lead various elements of our congregation. I view the committees as an extension of the Board of Directors as they are where the detail work around activities and events gets accomplished. We have over 20 committees and encourage everyone to participate on a committee to help make our synagogue reflect the interest of our members. Please reach out to the committee chair if you're interested in joining a committee please reach out to the Committee Chair found in the document below.

The natural progression for leadership within our congregation is for members to first join and get involved on a committee. As they get more involved, they may eventually rise to be the leader of that committee. Many of these leaders are also voted onto our Board of Directors where more strategic and financial decisions for the congregation are made. We then look to those on the Board of Directors to eventually expand their role by joining the Executive Board, culminating in the role of President.



Throughout my term, I learned first-hand that the responsibilities of the President have been too extensive as a volunteer position for a working professional like me, resulting in few people being willing to step up to take on this important leadership position. Last fall I brought together members of our Executive Board and Strategic Planning Committee to review some reasons for this reality and to develop a sustainable solution for the long term. Together we created a new leadership model where the responsibilities of the President would be distributed throughout the 6 members of the Executive Board. As such, I have delegated full authority for oversight of various committees and business operations to other members of the Executive Board. This new leadership model works in accordance with our existing bylaws which allow the President to assign special duties to officers and

directors.

Over the past 4 months I've seen a significant reduction in my workload (generally down to fewer than 8 hours/week), something I expect will make others feel more comfortable stepping up to the position of President in the future. What this means for you is that questions or issues which you've traditionally brought to the attention of the President may now be delegated to others on the Executive Board who can provide more focus for a timely resolution. The Executive Board now meets twice a month in order to facilitate communication and work together to resolve issues and concerns in a timely fashion. This model also has the benefit of cross training and providing more in-depth leadership experience to a broader group of people, thus putting us in a stronger position as we grow and embrace our future.

The 2023-2024 Proposed Slate of Officers includes myself as holding a third term as President of FVJC-Emek Shalom. In accordance with our bylaws, this shall be my last year as President. As we continue to implement this new leadership model, I will work closely with First Vice President Garry Berman to ensure a successful transition to our next FVJC-ES President in 2024.

It was a joy to have so much of our history in one room and to reconnect old colleagues and friends.

Committing to leadership is a gift to the community and helps FVJC-ES to remain strong. We thank you for your dedicated service.



And I will be here to support our teachers every step of the way. At present, we are still short on the number of teachers we need to fully round out our religious program. 
